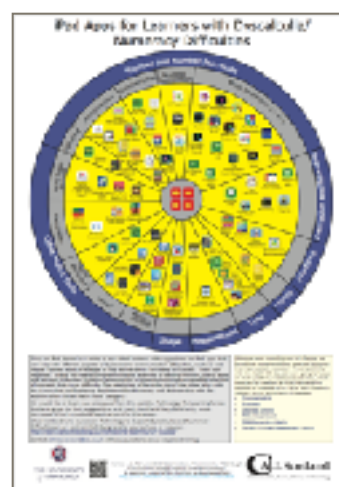

BOOKSHARE

Bookshare is an online library specifically designed for print disabilities. The website is accessible to everyone and user friendly. The website contains books and is free for US students. Canadian school boards and public libraries can authorize access to Bookshare. Check with your school or ask to sign up at your public library. You can log in to Bookshare on the website <https://www.bookshare.org/cms/>. Use the account information provided by your school or your public library.

For iPad and iPhone users, Bookshare content can be accessed through several apps such as Capti Narrator, Read2Go (\$) or Voice Dream Reader (\$). These apps can be purchased through the Apple Store.
