





What Ways Can Technology Help?

- Listen to words as I type them (text-to-speech)
- Dictate my words and turn into text (speech-to-text).
- Predictive typing (word suggestions to choose from)
- Check my grammar, find synonyms for me
- Get help with spelling: (e.g., ask Siri, dictionary and thesaurus lookup with a voice request)

What Ways Can Technology Help?

- Listen to work I have completed so I can "hear" where punctuation should be added.
- Use mind maps to create a graphical representation of my thoughts
- Export an outline from a mind map to start my writing
- Add (searchable) handwriting, and draw notes
- Annotate documents and pictures



Audio Recording Tools



AudioNote (free / \$6.99)

Some features:

- record audio,
- take notes time linked with the audio,
- skip within audio by tapping on related text



- quickly and easily record short notes as well as important ideas and set reminders using speech recognition.



Dictate notes, read text to me with word and sentence highlighting, annotate photos and notes, make checklists, add an audio file, or create a drawing. Scan printed pages or add photos and videos. Work collaboratively with someone else.

Popplet (free/\$6.99)
 simple to use; can share and brainstorm at same time - colour coding :)





Inspiration / Kidspiration Maps

(Free/\$13.99) IOS app, also available online; can convert maps to outlines for use later in Pages app.

• Padlet (Free)

-good for elementary and for sharing. Simple, device agnostic.



 MindMeister (Free and paid) - can export outlines to Google Docs, Chrome extension and online



• Mindomo (Free)

To Think About...

- Think about what's built-in on the devices you already have
- Be mindful of what needs WiFI to work, and what can work on its own
- Check out "free" first try the "lite" versions of apps and watch YouTube video reviews to see what the app is like before you purchase
- Read a number of reviews of apps BEFORE you purchase them
- Lots of good apps out there subscription services need to be extra good to compete and be worth the price
- Become informed about your own technology's capabilities
- Check what technology and apps are available at school e.g., using Google or Microsoft infrastructure
- Check what devices your school will let you bring to school
- Start small try only one or two new things at a time
- CHECK OUT PRIVACY of your online work don't leave any identifying info; and check what kids can also see and do while there!
- Make a backup of your important work
